Construction Notice: Diamond Heights Water Main Replacement Project

What: The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) will begin installation of new water mains to replace pipes that are approaching the end of their useful life.

When: Construction will begin the week of September 6, 2022. Weather and/or construction issues may impact the schedule.

Where: The first stage of construction will take place on Duncan Street from Douglass Street to approximately 500 feet east of Castro Street. See project webpage for a map of the overall work area and the three-week lookahead schedule. Or call or e-mail us for more information.

What to Expect During Construction:

- * Work will not be happening on your block for the entire project duration. Water main installation is done in phases, so there will also be periods of inactivity during the work dates
- * The project area includes Diamond St from 27th to Diamond Hts Blvd, 28th and Duncan Streets from Douglass to Noe Streets, Valley St from Diamond to Noe Streets, and Noe St from Duncan to Valley Streets, Portola Drive from 200 feet west of Clipper Street to 200 feet east of Clipper Street, Clipper Street from Portola Drive to Diamond Hts Blvd, Diamond Hts Blvd from Clipper Street to Duncan Street.
- * There will be noise, vibration, dust, parking and traffic impacts in the work zone and disruption to normal neighborhood activity.
- * Businesses and residents in the work zone will have access to their garages, although there may be temporary delays.
- * Parking will be prohibited in the immediate work zone during work hours.
