## 10. <u>New SFPUC Projects in the Bayview</u> (discussion only)(Campbell)

Shelby Campbell, SFPUC, Design Team provided information regarding new projects in the Bayview. The projects will provide workforce space for SFPUC employees as follows:

The San Francisco Water Department (SFWD) Yard currently located at 1990 Newcomb will now be located at 2000 Marin. There will be new Maintenance Operations & Engineering Buildings at the Southeast Plant (SEP). Clark Construction is the contractor with a start date of August/September and a projected completion in 2028.

## 11. <u>High Speed Rail (discussion only)(Tabor)</u>

Rebecca Tabor, Northern California Engagement Manager provided a statewide project overview. In 2023 there was a \$3.3 billion federal investment with 422 of a 500-mile radius environmentally cleared. The area from San Francisco to Los Angeles is scheduled for completion in 2024. Information was provided regarding Northern California partnerships and investments. Some of the approved project features in District 10 are three radio tower sites, improvements at 4<sup>th</sup> & King Streets, and Bayshore Station modifications. Some impacts to the community will be noise and traffic however, there will be no residential, community, or commercial displacements. There will be some property acquisition at the future Schlage Lock development in Visitacion Valley.

Ms. Tabor noted the benefits in District 10 will be:

- Access to statewide system at 4<sup>th</sup> & King
  - Reduced congestion on state highways & airports
  - Reduced air pollution
  - Long-term employment opportunities at the future Light Maintenance Facility in Brisbane
  - Eliminates diesel train operation overtime with Authority investment of Caltrain Electrification
