<u>Lobbyist Registration and Reporting Requirements</u>: Individuals and entities that influence or attempt to influence local legislative or administrative action may be required by the San Francisco Lobbyist Ordinance [SF Campaign & Governmental Conduct Code §2.100] to register and report lobbying activity. CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Approve and adopt the <u>CleanPowerSF Load Management Standards Plan</u> to meet the requirements of the California Energy Commission's Load Management Standards regulations regarding the development of electricity rates that vary hourly or sub-hourly and/or qualifying demand flexibility programs that use time-varying price signals based on the cost to produce electricity. The Plan does not propose to develop or adopt hourly or sub-hourly electricity rates nor qualifying demand flexibility programs at this time. (Hale)

Public Hearing to consider and approve the <u>Power Miscellaneous Fee schedule</u>, which includes the revision of existing fees and the elimination of certain fees for account and billing services related to the SFPUC's provision of electric service. If approved, the proposed fees will become effective July 1, 2024, and will remain effective until revised. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 31.04(h).
