CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at <a href="http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447">http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447</a>. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

- a) Award <u>Job Order Contract No. JOC-97</u>, General Engineering (A License) Construction, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, and Alameda Counties, in the amount not-to-exceed \$5,000,000, with a guaranteed minimum task order opportunity amount of \$50,000, and a duration of two years, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Ground Control Inc., to perform A-licensed general engineering construction work on San Francisco Public Utilities Commission systems and operations around the Bay Area.

- b) Accept work performed by Western Water Constructors, Inc., under <a href="Contract No. WW-667">Contract No. WW-667</a>, Mariposa Dry Weather Pump Station Improvements; Approve Modification No. 22 (Final) decreasing the contract amount by \$26,853, and increasing the contract duration by 216 calendar days, to revise the security gate/lockset to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act and concurrently complete remaining punch list items, for a total contract amount of \$18,506,438 and a total contract duration of 1,566 consecutive calendar days (approximately four years and four months); and authorize final payment to the contractor. Approve Amendment No. 5 to Contract No. CS-1408, Multi-Party Cost Share Contract for Los Vaqueros Reservoir Expansion Project Planning with Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Zone 7, Alameda County Water District, Contra Costa Water District, East Bay Municipal Utility District, Grassland Water District, San Luis & Delta-Mendota Water Authority, Santa Clara Valley Water District, and Los Vaqueros Reservoir Joint Powers Authority, to increase the not-to-exceed Contract amount by \$8,673,000, of which \$1,239,000 would be the not-to-exceed obligation of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, for a new total not-to-exceed amount of \$31,525,836, of which \$4,597,910 would be the total not-to-exceed obligation of the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, and extend the Contract duration by 12 months for a new total Contract duration of five years and four months. The requested increase in budget and time is due to additional roles and responsibilities assumed by parties to the Contract and due to delays in negotiation and execution of contracts with California Department of Water Resources, California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and permits with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation. Public hearing to consider and possible action to adopt revised <u>Rules and Regulations</u> <u>Governing Electric Service</u> (Rules) in conformance with the requirements of Charter section 4.104, effective October 22, 2023. The revised version of the Rules replaces in its entirety the original version that the Commission approved in February 2010 as well as amendments approved in November 2015 and May 2017. (Hale)

Authorize the General Manager to recommend that the San Francisco Director of Property execute a **Certificate of Acceptance** to accept an approximately seven-acre parcel, known as Block/Lot 8928/001, in fee and at no cost to the SFPUC, for the future site of the new **Treasure Island Wastewater Treatment Plant** (TI WWTP); approve the terms and conditions of the transfer; and authorize the General Manager to execute a 66-year lease with the Treasure Island Development Authority, a California non-profit public benefit corporation, as landlord, to use approximately three acres of land, comprising a portion of Block/Lot 8946/002, at no cost to the SFPUC, for the future development of wetlands appurtenant to the TI WWTP for the final stage of wastewater treatment.
