CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at <a href="http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447">http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447</a>. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

a) Approve an increase of 684 calendar days (approximately one year and 11 months) to the contract duration contingency for <a href="Contract No. DB-130">Contract No. DB-130</a> Bay Corridor Transmission and Distribution (BCTD) – Phase 3 (2019), with Beta Engineering California, LP., increasing the contract duration up to 1,479 consecutive calendar days (approximately four years), with no change to the contract amount, for administrative purposes to allow the completion of contractor-delayed construction activities and commissioning/testing to mitigate the risk of unplanned outages, and to conduct additional owner-requested distribution cable testing to reduce the likelihood of further impact to customers upon system reenergization.

- c) Approve Modification No. 1 to Job Order <u>Contract No. JOC-86</u>, General Engineering (A License) Construction, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, and Alameda Counties with Ground Control Inc. to increase the contract duration by one year for a total contract duration of three years, with no change to the contract amount, for additional time for facility and asset improvements. - d) Award Contract No. WD-2908(I), HVAC Mechanical Maintenance and As-needed Construction Repair Services to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Southland Industries, in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,338,466, with a duration of 1,095 consecutive calendar days (approximately three years). - e) Accept work performed by Pipe and Plant Solutions, Inc., under <u>Contract No. WW-675</u>, 5th/18th/Upper Larkin Street Sewer Inspection; approve Modification No. 2 (Final) decreasing contract amount by \$10,000, for a total contract amount of \$2,178,194, and increase contract duration by a total of 107 calendar days to permit completion of punch list

- items and finalize closeout documentation, for a total contract duration of 345 consecutive calendar days; and authorize final payment to the contractor. (Robinson)
