Lobbyist Registration and Reporting Requirements: Individuals and entities that influence or attempt to influence local legislative or administrative action may be required by the San Francisco Lobbyist Ordinance [SF Campaign & Governmental Conduct Code §2.100] to register and report lobbying activity. CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

5. CONSENT CALENDAR

- a) Award Job Order Contract No. JOC-92, General Engineering (A License) Construction, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Tuolumne Counties, Hetch Hetchy, for a total contract amount not-to-exceed \$5,000,000 with a minimum guaranteed opportunity amount of \$50,000 and a duration of two years, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Sierra Mountain Construction, Inc., to perform general engineering work in San Francisco Public Utilities Commission systems and operations around Hetch Hetchy. (Robinson)
- b) Approve a \$250,000 increase to the contract cost contingency and a 120 calendar day increase to the contract duration contingency for <u>Contract No. WD-2871</u>, Sunol Valley Water Treatment Plant and Chloramination Facility Aqua Ammonia Structural Repairs and Tank Replacement, with Cal State Constructors, for safe and proper cleaning and disposal of existing aqua ammonia tanks and for delays associated with the fabrication of new stainless steel tanks; and authorize the General Manager to approve future modifications to the contract for a total contract amount of up to \$2,279,883 and a total contract duration of up to 721 consecutive calendar days (approximately two years). - c) Approve an increase of \$2,000,000 to the contract cost contingency, and an increase of 368 calendar days to the contract duration contingency for <u>Contract No. WW-662R</u>, Southeast Water Pollution Control Plant (SEP) Power Feed and Primary Switchgear Upgrades, with Blocka Construction, Inc., to address additional differing site conditions, design clarifications, and potential additional extended Contractor's overhead related to the continued delay in delivery of SFPUC power to SEP and the extra time anticipated for installation of the substations; and authorize the General Manager to approve future modifications to the contract for a total contract amount of up to \$35,818,620 and a total contract duration of up to 1,655 consecutive calendar days (approximately four years and six months). - d) Approve the terms and conditions and authorize the General Manager to execute an <u>eight-year communications site lease to New Cingular Wireless PCS LLC</u>, doing business as AT&T Mobility, a Delaware limited liability company, to use approximately 400 square feet of space on the third floor of Building No. 800 of the Southeast Treatment Plant and certain

space on the rooftop of Building No. 800 for antenna equipment, all located at 1701 Jerrold Avenue, San Francisco, California, constituting a portion of Assessor's Block 5280, Lot 001, to operate, maintain, repair, and replace existing telecommunications facilities and related equipment at an annual rent of \$91,261.32 with four percent annual increases. e) Approve the terms and conditions and authorize the General Manager to execute an <u>eight-year communications site lease with New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC</u>, doing business as AT&T Mobility, a Delaware limited liability company, to use approximately 360 square feet of SFPUC Parcel 65 in the unincorporated Town of Sunol, California to operate, maintain, repair, and replace an existing telecommunications facility and related equipment for an annual rent of \$63,606.24, with four-percent annual increases.
